# The Cheshire Agricultural Society CIO - Data Protection Policy

The Cheshire Agricultural Society CIO recognises that you have rights surrounding the data we hold. Individuals may contact the Society's Data Protection Officer (DPO) and exercise your rights to be informed about the data we hold, have access to the data we hold, have your data rectified, your right to be forgotten and so forth. Should you make a data request the Society will endeavour to respond within the statutory period.

The Cheshire Agricultural Society CIO will endeavour to keep your data safe and will notify you and the Information Commissioners Officer (ICO) should it become aware of any data breach, within the legal time limit of 72 hours. If you are not satisfied at any time with the actions of the Cheshire Agricultural Society CIO, you have the right to contact the ICO at ico.org.uk or via their helpline on 0303 123 1113.

- 5 Entry Fees will be accepted by Cheque and Credit Card in <u>£ Sterling only</u>. Post-dated cheques will be returned. Please do not send cash through the post.

#### **DRESS FOR SHOWING**

All exhibitors <u>MUST</u> wear a suit or smart jacket with a tie. In cold conditions, a suitable smart top coat is acceptable. Exhibitors should only discard jackets by the express permission of the Judge.

Ladies are reminded that the dress code also applies to them. Please note that bare arms are not acceptable. Gilets (tweed or other colour) are not acceptable in the show ring. We also remind in-hand handlers that smart trousers should be worn. Jeans are not acceptable.

Suitable footwear should be worn. Wellington boots, trainers, slip on shoes and open toes shoes are unsafe and are not acceptable.

The dress code will be enforced for classes and for the Grand Parades.

## DRESS CODE FOR WOMEN

The dress code above also applies to women. Showing of horses in short sleeves, gilets, jodhpurs (except ridden classes) is not permissible.

## **OUTSIDE ASSISTANCE**

Exhibitors in all competitive classes (except foals, yearlings and ridden classes if the horses are stripped) are strictly prohibited from receiving any help, assistance or change of handler unless in the case of an emergency or serious threat of harm or risk to the exhibitor, other exhibitors, horses or any other individual. Exhibitors of foals and yearlings are permitted to have an assistant if needed for the individual 'show', and exhibitors of ridden horses are permitted to have an assistant if the horse is required to be stripped of the saddle. All assistants must be dressed appropriately for the show ring. They must not enter the ring until required and must leave the ring as soon as the relevant animal has completed its 'show' and returned to the line-up. In the event of a breach of this rule the exhibitor and person/persons providing such assistance will be disqualified from the Class. For the avoidance of doubt, this also includes 'whipping up'.

- 1 **ENTRY FEES** Under no circumstances will Entry Fees be returned in the case of cancellation of entries by an Exhibitor or because of postponement or cancellation of the Show for whatever reason.
- 2 Under no circumstances can an entry be moved from one class to another, or rider or horse substitutions made
- 3 All animals must be the bona-fide property of the Exhibitor at the time of entry.
- 4 All animals must be provided with ties and all animals must be halter led in the rings.
- Any person in charge of livestock exhibits who places the stock in their charge in any other place than that allocated to them or who removes or alters any number or name indicating the position of their exhibit, will be liable to expulsion from the Showground and their animals may be debarred from competition.
- ATTENDANTS Exhibitors or their attendants must remain with their exhibits during the whole time they are at the Show and must comply with and be governed by the Society's Rules and Regulations.
- 7 **HEADWEAR** Anyone riding a horse must wear a hat to British Standard specification and of a standard approved by the governing body of their respective horse society.
- 8 **DRESS** Exhibitors should be smartly dressed, gentlemen in smart jacket, trousers, shirt and tie, ladies in trousers or skirt, smart jacket and blouse. <u>Strictly no jeans</u>.
- 9 **NUMBERING OF EXHIBITS** All exhibits must display the number supplied by the Society for the appropriate class during judging or in the Parade. Failure to comply with this rule may result in mistakes being made on prize money payouts.
- 10 JUDGING will commence as near as circumstances allow at the times stated in the Schedule, under the respective sectional headings and Exhibitors will be responsible for their Exhibits being in their respective Ring at the proper time.
- JUDGES The Judges named in the Society's Prize Schedule and Show Catalogue or Programme have consented and have been appointed to act as Judges in the events indicated. The Committee reserve the right to appoint substitutes for any who may be unavoidably prevented from attending and all entries are accepted upon that understanding.

- 21 TEMPORARY PADDOCKS Exhibitors to remove temporary paddocks by 7.00 am on the Tuesday of the Show.
- 22 **CURRENT ANIMAL WELFARE LEGISLATION** applies at this Show and the Society will support any action where any breach of such legislation occurs.
- 23 **ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT** brought to the Show must have a current PAT test certificate.

- Traffic using A50 from the south, follow Show signs when approaching Holmes Chapel, to A54 road for Middlewich.
- Traffic using M6, leave M6 at Junction 18 (Holmes Chapel interchange). Turn left on to A54 towards Middlewich. At the roundabout approaching Middlewich follow Show signs turning right (A530) towards Northwich. Turn right at traffic lights and continue towards Northwich for about 4 miles to roundabout at junction with A556. Continue to follow Show signs and directions.

#### From East or West

• Leave M56 at Junction 10 and take A559 signposted Northwich. In Antrobus village, turn left and continue to follow Show signs.

When approaching the showground ignore SAT-NAV directions
Follow Green Route signage only
